Happy 5th Birthday BASF!

During Refugee Week (14 to 22 June), we will be celebrating our 5th birthday by holding an art show and having a birthday celebration at the Circle Café and Balmain Uniting Church in Balmain.

The art show will feature work by asylum seekers and refugees, as well as contributions from supporters who have provided works and paintings they wish us to sell in aid of BASF. All asylum seekers and refugees who give us works for sale will receive the monies raised and, of course, we don't take a commission.

The art show will commence on Saturday, 14 June and finish on the afternoon of Sunday, 22 June.

Our birthday celebration will be held on Sunday, 22 June from 2.00 to 5.00pm at the Balmain Uniting Church. The Mayor of Leichhardt, Councillor Carolyn Allen, will officially launch our birthday at 3.00pm and the Hon Tanya Plibersek, Federal Member for Sydney and Minister for Housing will speak.

The Circle Café and Balmain Uniting Church are both located at 344 Darling Street, Balmain. The café is open from 7.30am until 3.00pm Monday to Saturday.

Balmain Uniting Church will be holding a special Refugee Week Service on Sunday, 15 June at 9.30am. It will address the current situation facing asylum seekers.

There will be no charge for our birthday function as there has been generous assistance from Leichhardt Council and the City of Sydney. Donation baskets will be at the entrance for people who wish to make a donation.

Copies of *Acting from the Heart*,

stories written by asylum seeker and refugee supporters, edited by Dr Sara Mares and Professor Louise Newman (one of our patrons) and short-listed for the Human Rights and Equal Opportunity Commission non-fiction award in 2007, will be on sale. Also some DVDs and CDs will be available for purchase.

People we are Assisting

As we go to print our recipients number in excess of 120 people. They include many Chinese (some of whom are Falun Gong practitioners while others are underground Christians and dissidents), African nationals (including Algerians and Moroccans), Middle-Eastern nationals, Burmese, Nepalese, sub-continental Indians and Sri Lankans.

Many of our recipients are awaiting court and Refugee Review Tribunal decisions, while others are awaiting decisions from the Hon Chris Evans, Minister for Immigration. The latter group may be awaiting humanitarian visas.

The number of people we are helping at any one time rises and falls depending on the number of new applicants requiring assistance at our monthly meetings and the number of refugees we support who have received work rights, are able to work, and no longer require our assistance.

Kate's Important Contribution

Kate Maclurcan is the part-time Coordinator assisting BASF to raise funds. Leichhardt Council provides half the funding for her position with smaller grants from some 10 other Councils including a \$5,000 grant from City of Sydney for community awareness seminars.

Leichhardt Council's approval at its 22 April Meeting to provide triennial funding to keep Kate Maclurcan's position going was a wonderful endorsement of BASF's work and the importance of Kate's contribution.

Apart from assisting with fund raising events like the raffle at the Acoustica Festival, Kate applied to 18 local councils for community development grants which boosted BASF funds last year by \$87,800.

Our Funds

Our funds are drying up but the Management Committee anticipates that we can continue until November of this year. Many of the refugees we are currently assisting are likely to obtain work rights within the next few months. But it is hard to know how many more people will be placed on Bridging Visa Es without work rights and will need our assistance in future.

No more Temporary Protection Visas

While the Federal Government has met its commitment to give Permanent Protection Visas to those who are refugees i.e. those who meet one of 5 narrow definitions, we are shocked to find that those recognized as deserving of a visa on humanitarian grounds have not been included. We are also concerned that the Minister will remove his power to grant a visa while the Refugee Review Tribunal consists of only one member who makes a decision which may result in the person being deported to imprisonment, torture, "disappear" or being constantly on the run to avoid such outcomes.

Parliamentary Joint Standing Committee on Migration

Early in May, three members of our Committee - Fr Jim Carty from House of Welcome, Tamara Domicej from the Asylum Seeker Centre, and ex-officio member Debby Nicholls, representing Balmain for Refugees and Bridge for Asylum Seekers attended roundtable briefings on Villawood Immigration Detention Centre held by the Parliamentary Joint Standing Committee on Migration. The briefings were chaired by Michael Danby MP. Other members of the Joint Committee participating

were Senators Andrew Bartlett and Anne McEwen, and MPs Danna Vale and Tony Zappia.

As well as matters relating to detention, the Roundtable also addressed conditions faced by asylum seekers on release from Villawood and in the community, which gave us an opportunity to raise a number of our concerns. The matter of work rights for all holders of Bridging Visa E's was, of course, raised as of particular importance, and our members were able to stress the benefits both to the asylum seekers and the community of allowing more participation in the work force.

The associated problem of access to medical care and other community facilities was also discussed, as well as the severe financial hardship caused to sponsors when a bond has been required for the Bridging Visa. All of those who took part felt it was a very useful session.
